



The European Research Council (ERC) Starting grants provide attractive and long-term funding that supports excellent researchers at early career stage ready to work independently. Researchers must demonstrate the ground-breaking nature, ambition, and feasibility of their research proposal.

Who can apply

Researchers of any nationality with **2-7** years of experience since completion of **PhD**, with a promising track record and an excellent research proposal. Eligibility can be extended under certain circumstances, such as maternity/paternity leave, clinical training military service and long-term illness¹.

Which proposals are eligible

- Any field of research.
- Research must be conducted in a public or private research organisation based in an EU member state or associated country.
- One or more team members can be located in a non-European country.

Swiss participation in Starting Grants

The current status of **Switzerland** is that of a **non-associated third country**. Scientists based in a Swiss Host institution **are not eligible to apply to an ERC StG grant**. The <u>SNSF</u> has been mandated by the Swiss federal government to put in place transitional measures.

Success rate

Starting Grants are highly competitive with a success rate below 16%.

Funding

Up to € 1 500 000 for a period of five years.

Dates

The ERC-2024-StG call opens 11 July 2023 with a deadline on 24 October 2023.

What to do once the call is open

- Contact your host institution early enough to organise their letter of support.
- Look at past <u>ERC funded projects</u>.
- Contact your <u>ERC National Contact Point</u> or your nearest <u>Regional Office</u> and allow enough time for reviews and feedback of the draft proposal.

How to apply

The calls are published on the <u>Funding and Tenders Portal</u> which contains all information about the call, the templates, and the submission process. If you do not have an account, you need to <u>register on the portal</u>. After that you can start your submission.
